Other select credits include: I Am My Own Wife (Long Wharf Theatre), Only Human (St. Clement's), Tech Support (59E59 Theaters), Till (New York Musical Festival), Zen AM and I Am Antigone (Theater for the New City), Hatefuck (WP Theater), Soft Butter (Ars Nova), Melt (High Line), Thunderbodies (Soho Rep), Ann and Skeleton Crew (Dorset Theatre). She holds an MFA in stage management from the Yale School of Drama. BA in Theatre Technical Design from Binghamton University.

MIRANDA ANDERSON (Stage Manager) makes her TheatreSquared debut. She is based in Chicago, where she has recently stage-managed with Writers Theatre on Once and Athena. She has frequently worked with TimeLine Theatre, where she stage managed What the Constitution Means to Me, Trouble In Mind, Campaigns, Inc., Relentless, Kill Move Paradise, and In the Next Room (or the vibrator play). From 2012 to 2018, she toured with The Hypocrites' Gilbert and Sullivan productions of Pirates of Penzance, Mikado, and HMS Pinafore to regional theatres including Olney Theatre Company, Pasadena Playhouse, Skirball Center at NYU, Berkeley

Repertory Theatre, Actors Theatre of Louisville and American Repertory Theatre in Boston. She is currently the Stage Management Instructor at Loyola University of Chicago, where she received her B.A. in Theatre. Miranda is a proud member of the Actors' Equity Association.

AMBER HOLLEY (Assistant Stage Manager) returns to TheatreSquared for their second season. Previous ASM credits include Dial M for Murder, Violet, Chicken & Biscuits, Sanctuary City, Stones in His Pocket's, and It Came From Outer Space. Following their graduation from Indiana University Northwest with a degree in Theatre in May 2020, they were a member of TheatreSquared's Spring 2022 Apprenticeship program where they acted as runcrew coverage for *Tiger* Style! and The Elaborate Entrance of Chad Deity. Other runcrew credits at T2 includé *Miss You Like Hell* and *Kim'*s Convenience.

**ROBERT FORD** (Artistic Director) is an award-winning playwright, novelist and musician who helped found TheatreSquared in 2005, and since then has co-produced 90 plays and musicals and facilitated the development of over 85 new works. Most recently, T2 featured his new play-in-progress, *The Grove of Forgetting*, in the 2023 Arkansas New Play Festival. With Amy Herzberg, he co-adapted two versions of A Christmas Carol for T2, T2 has produced several of his plays, including Fault, The Spiritualist, The Fall of the House (also Alabama Shakespeare Festival—Edgar Award nominee), Look Away, 'Twas the Night, and adaptations of Great Expectations, My Father's War and It's a Wonderful Life. His critically acclaimed first novel, The Student Conductor, was a Barnes & Noble Discover Great New Writers pick. He holds a MMus degree from Yale and MFAs in acting from Rutgers and in playwriting & screenwriting from the University of Texas at Austin.

SHANNON A. JONES (Executive Director) joined TheatreSquared in 2014, navigating roles from assistant stage manager to the helm. In her time at T2, she's managed, supported and uplifted a multitude of artists, worked as a liaison with Crystal Bridges, facilitated donor and artist engagement, mentored emerging stage managers, and has also served as a member of the TRUE initiative/TRAIN cohort of NWA. She fostered the development of T2's DEIA goals, oversees the company's 100

employees, organizes the budgeting process, and manages the logistics for the annual Arkansas New Play Festival. She was recognized in the 2023 Northwest Arkansas Forty Under 40 class. Highlights of some of her behind-the-scenes work at T2 include Peter and the Starcatcher, The Champion and The Legend of Georgia McBride, to name a few. As a Florida native and former freelance stage manager, she's worked at theatres spanning the east coast, from Florida to Maine. She holds a BFA in Stage Management from the University of Central Florida and is a member of Actors' Equity Association.

**ITAMAR MOSES** (Book) is the author of the full-length plays Outrage, Bach at Leipzig, Celebrity Row, The Four of Us, Yellowjackets, Back Back Back, Completeness and The Whistleblower; the musicals Nobody Loves You (with Gaby Alter), Fortress of Solitude (with Michael Friedman) and The Band's *Visit* (with David Yazbek); and the evening of short plays Love/Stories (Or But You Will Get Used To It). His work has appeared Off-Broadway and elsewhere in New York, at regional theaters across the country and in Canada, Hong Kong, Israel, Venezuela, Turkey and Chile, and is published by Faber & Faber and Samuel French. Awards for his work include Lucille Lortel, New York Drama Critics Circle, Outer Critics Circle and Obie awards in New York, as well as awards from the Portland, San Diego, Dallas, and Bay Area Theatre Critics Circles. He's received new play commissions from The McCarter, Playwrights Horizons, Berkeley Rep, The Wilma Theater, South Coast Rep, Manhattan Theatre Club, Lincoln Center, and Goodman Theatre. On television, Itamar has written for TNT's Men of a Certain Age, HBO's Boardwalk Empire, and WGN'S Outsiders. He holds an MFA in Dramatic Writing from NYU and has taught playwriting at Yale and NYU. He is a member of the Dramatists Guild and is a New York Theatre Workshop Usual Suspect. Born in Berkeley, CA', he now lives in Brooklyn, NY.

DAVID YAZBEK (Music & Lyrics) A varied career as a recording artist, Emmy-winning TV and film writer, music producer and pianist has somehow led Yazbek to a career on Broadway. His four shows, The Fully Monty, Dirty Rotten Scoundrels, Women on The Verge of a Nervous Breakdown, and The Band's Visit were all Tony nominated for Best Score. Yazbek took home the Tony for Best Score for The Band's Visit. The Fully

*Monty* won him the Drama Desk Award for Best Music. As a recording artist, Yazbek is responsible for five albums: The Laughing Man (winner NAIRD award, Best Pop Album of the Year), Tock, Damascus, Tape Recorder and Evil Monkey Man. He also produced the original cast albums of The Band's Visit, The Fully Monty, Dirty Rotten, Scoundrels, and Women on The Verge of a Nervous Breakdown, the first three of which were nominated for Grammy Awards. Yazbek scored the final season of HBO's Boardwalk Empire, scored and performed the music for Larry David's giant Broadway hit *Fish* in the Dark, and built an Ikea storage shelf. Yazbek teamed up with 13 librettist Robert Horn to collaborate on the musical Tootsie, which won the Tony for Best Book of a Musical and was nominated for a total of 11 Tony Awards, including Best Musical.

**WRITERS THEATRE** (Co-production partner) boldly looks to the future as it begins its 31st season. Having captivated audiences for years with its dedication to creating the most intimate theatrical experience possible, the theatre is now a major Chicagoland cultural destination with a national reputation for excellence, being called "America's finest regional theater company" by The Wall Street Journal. Since 1992, Writers Theatre has stayed true to its core values: valuing the power of the written word and uplifting the artists who bring that word to life. The company has produced over 120 productions everything from inventive interpretations of classics to groundbreaking new work. In 2016, Writers Theatre opened a new, state-of-the-art facility designed by the internationally renowned Studio Gang Architects. The new facility has allowed the Theatre to accommodate its growing audience, while maintaining its trademark intimacy. Writers Theatre now welcomes more than 60,000 patrons each season and has helped establish the North Shore of Chicago as a premier cultural destination. Through its Literary Development Initiative, which has been responsible for the nurturing and premiering of over two dozen world premieres, the theatre has established itself as a major originator of new theatrical works. Serving as an extension of the Writers Theatre mission, WT Education programs engage hundreds of students each year with active learning opportunities centered around the written word.

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




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
